April 15, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 in the Learning Center of the Stevens County Historical Society.

The next meeting will be on May 20th at the Kettle Falls Historical Center.

Award submissions to the Washington State Historical Society were discussed at length. Joe will submit nominations in the name of the Heritage Network for the Robert Gray Medal for Sue Richart and the Governor's Award for Excellence in Teaching History for Dwight Morgan. Kathy Berrigan will amend the current account of Dwight's accomplishments to use in the nomination.

Bill Sebright reported that the Valley Historical Society is facing a change of plans for the Little White School House, which the new superintendent of the school district would like to see removed from school grounds to the Valley Fair Grounds instead of being moved within the school grounds.

The Indian Agency Cabin is awaiting a change in the weather so that doors and windows can be installed before a July deadline.

The NeWGS will host a workshop on DNA September 14 with guest speaker, Emily Aulicino, an expert on DNA and genealogy.

The Kettle Falls Historical Center will open on May 15th. A special exhibit is in the works for beaded moccasins.

The Clayton-Deer Park Historical Society has new display cases and a curio cabinet. While not yet a museum, attendance at meetings has increased because of the new building.

Stevens County Historical Society museum is ready to open with 4 new exhibits and its own collection of beaded moccasins. They could use more volunteer docents.
